Description English Composition I is a course in expository writing, including the development and revision of paragraphs and essays using various rhetorical strategies; reading and discussion of selected essays; introduction to writing about literature; and introduction to incorporation and documentation of material from primary, secondary and tertiary sources.

Learning outcomes Upon successfully completing this course, the student will be able to:

- write analytical arguments, well-supported by evidence/examples;
- use online academic databases to find relevant information for writing projects;
- incorporate material from external sources in their writing projects, using correct citation;
- understand the requirements of academic integrity;
- understand the concept of plagiarism and know how to avoid it;
- correctly use MLA citation format.
